

Volcanic Disturbance at Sea.— A "seaquake," as it is called, was felt very severely off Cape Farewell on the night of the 18th October. The brig "Deva" was running seven knots at the time, and it brought the ship up stationary. According to the captain's statement, she appeared to be running over some rough rock, and the shock to the ship was something fearful. Everyone on deck was taken off his feet. Every lamp in the ship was put out, glasses all shattered to pieces, whilst every timber in the vessel appeared to be tearing asunder. The shock lasted about a minute. —Melbourne Atgus.
