

EARTHQUAKE SHOCKS AT SEA.

Capt. Olsen, of the Norwegian bark *Inga*, which arrived yesterday from Batavia, reports that during the night of Feb. 14, when 80 miles north north-west of Engraw Island, which is in the Eastern Archipelago, severe earthquake shocks were felt. The ship trembled so that the seamen in their berths woke up in alarm and hurried on deck. The sea, which had been perfectly calm, suddenly became confused. The water foamed and boiled violently and waves rose to a great height. For about two minutes earthquake shocks rapidly succeeded each other. Afterward the sea became calm again.

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
