## SHOCK TO FRENCH LINER.

NEW YORK, August 24.—Officers of the trans-Atlantic liner France, which has arrived at New York harbour, reported an unexplained submarine disturbance off the Ambrose lightships. The disturbance rocked the France, throwing some passengers from deck-chairs, bruising others, and exciting all, the passengers fearing that the vessel had grounded until Captain Aubert reassured them.

The officers said that the activity continued for three minutes, but none attempted to explain the occurrence.
